Board Changes

Ellen Simmons, Chris Cooper, Karen Bailey, and Bruce Geoffrion are retiring from the Board. Whether serving as an officer, drawing up designs for the neighborhood flag, or playing a crucial part of neighborhood events, we thank them for their time and energy!

We have great candidates who have stepped forward. You can read the candidate statements on the next page, and fill out the ballot by voting for 5 of them. The top five will be elected to three-year terms. The sixth candidate will be elected to a two-year term, and the seventh to a one-year term.

Just cut out and mail in the ballot to the address listed. Ballots must be received by January 6 to be counted.

On the reverse side of the ballot is the 2022 Resident Survey. That is the place to let the Board know your priorities, your concerns, *and your solutions* to issues we face as a neighborhood. This year's survey is open ended. We look forward to reading your responses!

Dues and Donations

Dues will be \$49.50 for 2022. This is the first increase in over five years.

There aren't quite as many budget dollars as there are worthy investments in Southwood Park's future. If you want to make an additional donation to programs like street trees, gardening, Roundabout redesign, or social events to increase their impact, you can do that.

What Do Our Dues Provide?

It's the time of year for dues. If you're new to Southwood Park, you'll want to know what your dues are used for:

- Nightly Security Patrols from Allen Protection Services
- Professional bookkeeping and handling of HOA letters by Above & Beyond Community Management
- Community-building social events like our Annual Block Party
- Plants and materials for more than a dozen gardens in public areas and a gardener to care for them
- City street trees are cost-shared making them "free" upon request
- Legal advice for the Association to resolve property disputes
- Dedicated radar speed sign
- Website and social media
- Neighborhood "Welcome Wagon"
- Fertilization and weed control on esplanades
- Entrance pillars maintained & insured
- Garage sale signs, banners, and ads
- Printing and mailing newsletters
